Accreditation Summary

All Saints Academy completed an extensive self-study as part of the accreditation process through the Michigan Non-Public Schools Accreditation Association (MNSAA). Below is a summary from the Diocese of Grand Rapids Assistant Superintendent, Jill Annable:

On behalf of the Diocese of Grand Rapids, the Office of Catholic Schools, and the Accreditation Site Team we are pleased to inform you and the All Saints Academy school community that we fully affirm this community and the work you have done to receive accreditation status. I have forwarded your study to MNSAA for full consideration.

Upon the conclusion of the Site Visit, the Site Visit Team commends All Saints Academy in the following areas:

- In merging four schools into one, great strides were made to create one unified school: the four core values of Faith, Learning, Loving, Serving exemplify the mission, the school's shared purpose of "Forming Saints to Serve All" is emerging as the focus, and the Mission Effectiveness Committee has created vision for ASA's "Profile of a Graduate." Programming for service projects, religious activities, cross-grade projects, and the celebration of whole-school Mass continue to show the unity of the two campuses; the efforts of these programs should continue as ASA sustains its unity.
- ASA has tremendous market potential with the child care program, the beautiful outdoor space at the middle school campus, and the existing space within both buildings. The possibilities are endless! The team recognizes that ASA leadership has vision for the school's

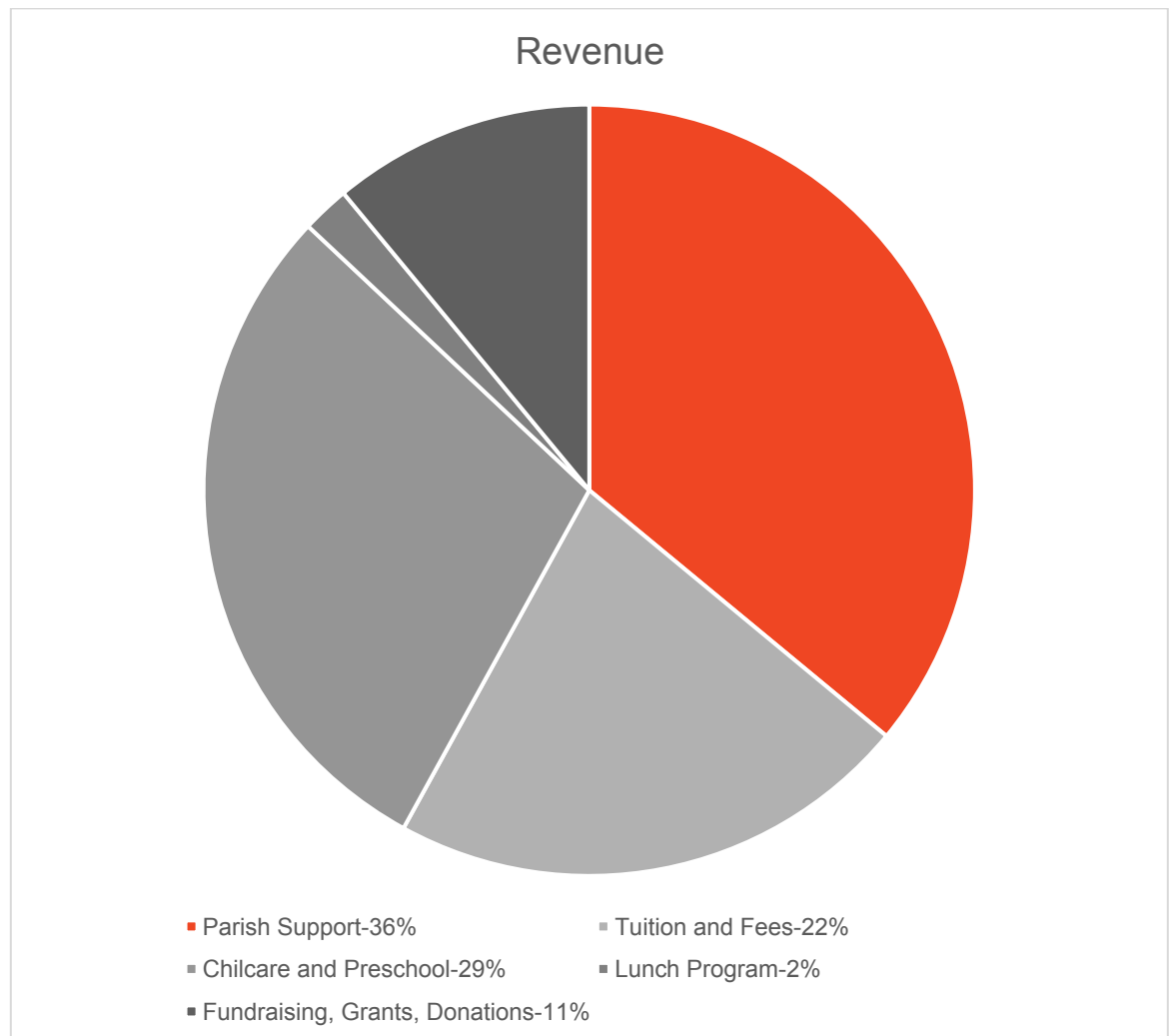
potential, and the team strongly recommends launching such ideas into action.

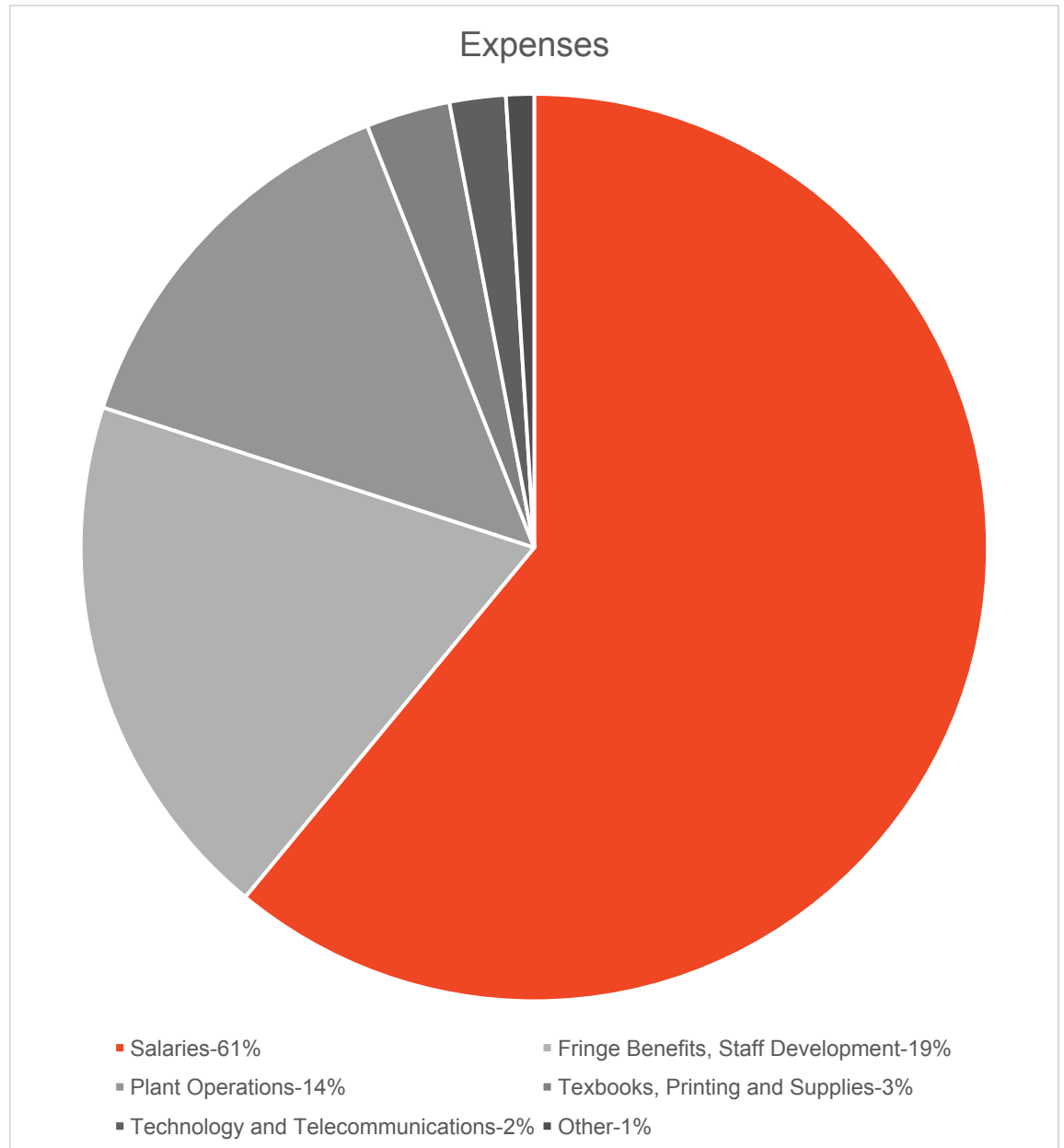

ACRE Test

The ACRE test is administered to students in 5th and 8th grade.

- The acronym stands for Assessment of Catechesis/Religious Education.
- This test is published by the NCEA (National Catholic Educational Association).
- The NCEA ACRE is an assessment based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the most recent catechetical documents.
- The purpose of the NCEA ACRE is to evaluate the effectiveness of a religion program:

The printed curriculum communicated during a teaching-learning session and the formative experiences in and with the faith community, for example, Sunday Liturgy.

“No single evaluative paper and pencil instrument can measure a person’s love of God or faith. However, especially in the formative years, knowing where one stands in relation to knowledge of the faith and faith awareness can help engender a desire to know more about God and the Church. The goal of catechesis/religious education is to foster a relationship with Jesus Christ that leads to maturity in faith. Such maturity will only be achieved through a lifelong pursuit of prayerful faith formation based on the realization that “the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us” (Romans 5:5). The revised NCEA ACRE is a tool to assist school and parish catechetical leaders in providing a sound comprehensive religion program.”

Building a Community of Exceptional Learners

*The Vision of All Saints Academy is to provide a transformative education that is grounded in the Catholic faith. Guided by the Holy Spirit, **this education meets the needs of individual learners**, preparing them to make a positive impact on others.*

Meeting the needs of individual learners is not always an easy task. While a “one size fits all” approach might be more cost effective, we know targeting specific areas for growth is best for our students’ learning. As we continue to add resources for student supports so that each child receives what they deserve, costs are also added.

In December of 2017, a development plan was put together to address three areas that would improve the way in which we help our students. The first area of the plan called for increased professional capacity. Additional personnel was needed specifically at the Middle School Campus. We also looked to increase hours from other support positions. The second area of our plan called for increased tools and resources for our exceptional learners. Fundraising efforts have allowed us to purchase diagnostic reading programs and tools like flexible seating options and sensory equipment. The third area to be addressed includes professional development. Not only will we be improving the knowledge of our staff, but we hope to offer educational experiences for both our students and parent community.

Over \$50,000 was raised for these efforts in 2017-2018 . We are so thankful for the generosity of a number of donors who believe that Catholic education is for everyone. We are thankful for the hardworking faculty and staff at All Saints Academy that embraces a culture of inclusion, welcoming students with diverse learning needs.
