Service

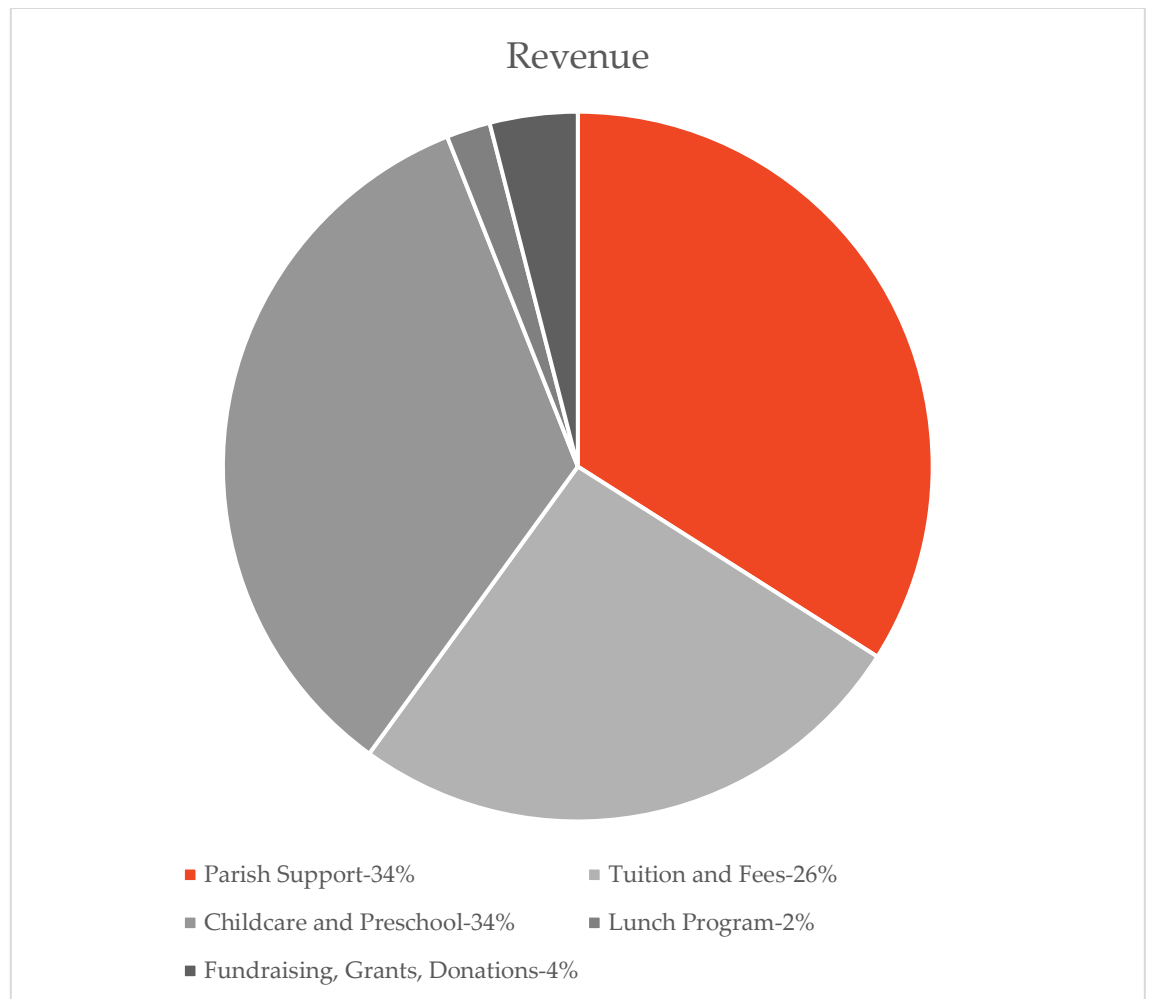

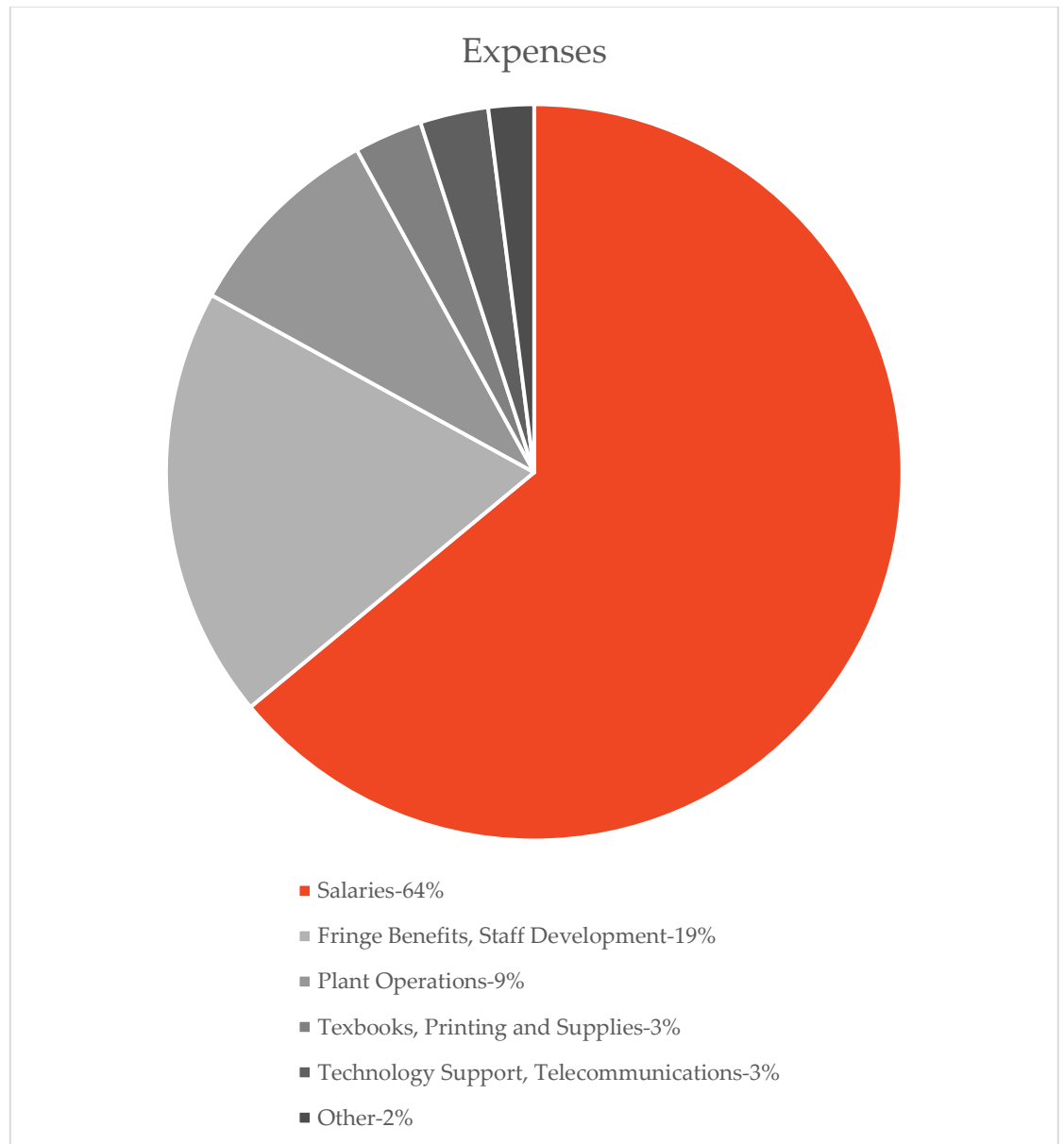

COVID-19

No one could have predicted how the 2019-2020 school year ended. From March 19 until June 5, All Saints Academy students completed their academic experience remotely. Over these fifty days of remote learning, we were able to creatively adjust in order to meet the needs of our parents and students. Here are a few things we experienced together during the COVID-19 shut down:

- After spring break, we incorporated morning prayer as a whole school community at 8:45 am via Google Meet.
- Father Tom began offering an online ASA School Mass on Thursday morning from the St. Jude chapel.
- For our spring 2020 remote learning plan, teachers prepped and shared three to five core academic learning objectives for students to work on during the week. Fridays were reserved for wrapping up work from the week and opportunities for co-curricular subjects such as physical education, art, music, band, technology, and Spanish, as well as some social-emotional offerings from Mrs. Stoner.
- We also established a regular weekly Google Meet schedule for preschool through 8th grade classes allowing for all classes to have virtual contacts with their teachers as a group. There were also 60 to 80 weekly small group or 1-on-1 virtual student support sessions schedule with various faculty.
- 8th grade graduation was moved to a simple Mass celebrated on July 27, 2020. St. Alphonsus Parish hosted us and livestreamed the event via Facebook for us. We were able to welcome students and their immediate families to Mass and sent them home with a gift bag that included their awards, diplomas and a few other small treats.
- We fundraised over \$35,000 for ASA's COVID relief fund. These donations enabled ASA to help families and staff members in need as well as prepare to return to in-person learning for the 2020-2021 school year.
